It's your responsibility to locate and mark your property line pins if necessary so you're not trespassing. Vehicles can also be driven on the roads in Wildwood and Pike National Forest to the east of Wildwood.**

Also a reminder that your vehicles and campers in the storage area, as well as on your property must have current tags per Park County. Thank you to everyone who did put

current tags on their vehicles, boats and trailers in the storage area. If you would like to move a trailer, RV, vehicle, etc. to the storage area, Art can help you with that.

New Horizon has stated they are concentrating their efforts on mining locations in Wyoming. With the price of uranium dropping and New Horizon's own stock trading for pennies they need to concentrate where they feel they can be successful. I like to think the grassroots movement in South Park was a surprise to New Horizon. I don't think they were expecting such opposition. Keep in mind though, once uranium mining becomes lucrative again, some companies might return to South Park.
